
Goals for 2019-2020

Duolingo -

100XP of Duolingo is due weekly unless otherwise stated by the teacher. Assignments will appear in your Duolingo home page on Monday. You must complete the assignment by Sunday at 8:00 pm, <u>no exceptions</u>. If the assignment is late student <u>will not</u> receive credit for the week.

- Testing out of skills **will not** count towards your 100xp.
- LATE DUOLINGO <u>WILL NOT BE</u> ACCEPTED. If the student is absent for an extended time (<u>more than two back to back class periods</u>), the student must contact the teacher to schedule a make-up due date for the corresponding Duolingo.

Homework-

Homework will be given weekly and due dates should be recorded on the student's planner. Due dates will depend on what we are working on. It is **the student's** responsibility (not the parent's) to contact the teacher about make up work for absent days. Parents, if your student will be absent more than one class period due to sickness, please do contact the teacher.

Late work-

Student will lose 10% for late assignment and will lose an additional 10% each week the assignment is late. It is the student's responsibility to check grades on Renweb to see any missing assignments.

Make-up work

It is **the student's** (not the parents') responsibility to **contact the teacher to schedule a time** to make up work due to
absents. Teacher is available at most recess to make-up work.

Quiz/Test

Quizzes are given periodically, and each quiz may be retaken once to replace a low grade. You have one week after receiving your graded quiz to retake it. You must turn in your current graded quiz at the time of the quiz re-take.

Test- You may not retake a test; however, you may make up points by following and completing the comments/red marks given by the teacher. Student may receive a half point per every point missed on the test. You must turn in your current graded test with the makeup test.

Projects and Presentations

We will have fun projects and presentations during the school year. More information will be provided with the assignments.

Participation

Participation is a great part of your grade! When you are in class you are expected to be prepared, respectful, on time and to always try your best to speak in Spanish. I will give weekly participation points based on the following criteria: (see next slide)
