Student Spotlight: Simeon Rainney





Saint Spotlight of the Month



Saint Elizabeth of Hungary was born in 1207 to King Andrew II and Gertrude of Merania.

She was given to prayer, humility, and piety from a young age, despite her noble birth. Her early life would be tempered with tragedy, losing both her mother at age 6 and fiancé at age 9 to untimely deaths. The deaths seemed to have the effect of deepening Elizabeth's prayer life which brought her peace. Elizabeth married Ludwig, in 1221.

Elizabeth used her position to live simply but care charitably for her people and even took bread to them, and cared for them during the Plague of Thuringia. Elizabeth's provision for the poor was not popular

with all. During one such trip, she was confronted with the accusation that she was stealing bread from the castle to give to the poor. As she opened her cloak, all that was revealed was a bouquet of fragrant roses, not the large rations of bread. When Franciscan Friars arrived in 1223, she learned of St. Francis' ideals and further molded herself to those.

Her husband Ludwig died of disease in 1227, crushing her. Elizabeth lived an austere life of a nun and vowed never to remarry. A year later she founded a hospital in honor of St. Francis where she tended to the sick and would become a 3rd Order Franciscan.

She passed away in 1231 at the age of 24.

After her passing, numerous healing miracles would take place at her gravesite near her hospital from 1232-1235, which spurred her cause for sainthood after investigation. Pope Gregory IX canonized her on May 27, 1235.

St. Elizabeth's feast day is November 17. She is the patron saint of bakers, beggars, brides, charities, death of children, homeless people, hospitals, Sisters of Mercy, widows. View the following links for ideas to celebrate her at home as a family!





Parking on the south side of the new school building paved and striped! Plants going in and light poles will be placed soon.


Four square courts were painted near the outdoor lunch pavilion. Lots of outdoor fun awaits our students in the beautiful play areas!



The west facing interior of the church.




The east facing interior of the church.
