
## 4th Grade David and Goliath Challenge




Now is a great time to gather supplies together! Every bit helps, so thank you so much for helping us help this wonderful school!

# Saint of the Month

Also, this month (Jan 28), we celebrate St. Thomas Aquinas' feast day. Born in 1225 in Sicily, he is considered to be one of the two most significant theologians of the church. His book, Summa Theologica was noted by Pope Leo XIII to be second only the Bible in the Catholic faith.

During his life, he was seen levitating in weeping prayer before a great crucifix, speaking to the Lord. After his death in 1274, his body remained uncorrupt, smelled of flowers, and great numbers came to his tomb and were healed by touching him.





# Moving in to the New School Building, Our Community Working Together








