The first half of the school year has been full of STREAM activities. Students have engaged in coding, robotics, Project Based Learning Units, and STREAM challenges. Our Halloween STREAM event brought to life the story of "The Biggest Pumpkin Ever". by Steven Kroll, where the students had to design an object to move a pumpkin. For our Thanksgiving all school STREAM event, we participated in the celebration for the success of the Fun Run by designing solar ovens to cook smores. The students designed their own solar ovens out of recyclables and a limited list of materials. It was an educational and delicious event! The elementary classes learned all about coding through Minecraft, and continued their fun with our Dash Robots. Early December, ACS participated in the Hour of Code which is celebrated throughout the world. 2022 will bring even more STEMtastic events such as two more all school events occurring during Catholic Schools Week and the End of the Year, Engineering Week (Begins February 20th), even more coding and robotics, and STREAM challenges. STREAM is such an integral part of the classroom, and our students are now "Pros" after the addition to our curriculum 7 years ago. STREAM creates tools for our students such as creativity which leads to innovation, problem-solving, collaboration with classmates, tech use and experimentation. 


Dominic's Travels to Egypt!

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Alumni News

Congratulations to ACS alumni Qiliana Garcia, ACS class of 2017, who recently earned her Stars and Stripes award from the American Heritage Girls.

Stars and Stripes is the highest award in American Heritage Girls. It includes a service project that gives back to the community, plus a spiritual walk essay, resume, and minimum of 15 badges

completed at the Pioneer/Patriot level (7th – 12th grades). The award is a culmination of the pillars of the AHG program, faith, leadership, emotional & social, outdoors, citizenship and life skills. Qiliana was approved as a Stars and Stripes candidate May 2019. At the time, people complimented her idea while inside she struggled with her false witness. Here are her project notes...

Junior year of high school (2020), "There was fire in my soul! A new love for my faith and for Christ. I realized to survive; I needed a prayer life. I began attending Eucharistic adoration and prayed the Divine Mercy Chaplet weekly. As I talked to Jesus, expanding myself in Him. I grew most fond of the Stations of the Cross - the markers of Jesus' footsteps to death. They were poetic and gruesome; however, incredibly healing for me. I figured there should be something made to show how much I've grown as a child of God. A light-bulb went off - I can provide the most beautiful and true meaning of sacrifice."

"Implementation weekend (July 29&30, 2021) didn't go as planned. At mid-day, only 1 pillar completed and 2 bulging at the seams. I asked my father; how can this be improved?" A mesh wire was added to the corners of each station and additional crosswire every 2 inches to hold the outside shape. Plus, the rocks had to be layered with more care. "I learned an invaluable lesson — ask for guidance, pray, don't give up, be flexible, communicate and know family will always be there for you."

The project was completed on August 5, 2021, with over 800 hours from over 40 volunteers from parishioners of St. Gabriel, students, staff and parents at ACS and sister AHG Troops! "This truly was a community project." September 9, 2021, Qiliana was accepted and approved by AHG as the 856th Stars and Stripes Recipient, the 7th in Arizona and the 2nd in St. Gabriel's Troop AZ0015. The Stations of the Cross were blessed by Fr. Chad King on December 12, 2021.





Qiliana graduated from Xavier College Prep in 2021 and is a freshman at Franciscan University, Steubenville, OH. Thank you Qiliana, for your amazing effort to bring these outdoor Stations of the Cross to our campus. We appreciate you!
