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Parents Need to Know

Sextortion Online (From FBI.gov)

The FBI has seen a huge increase in the number of cases involving children and teens being threatened and coerced into sending explicit images online — a crime called **sextortion**.

Sextortion can start on any site, app, messaging platform, or game where people meet and communicate. In some cases, the first contact from the criminal will be a threat. The person may claim to already have a revealing picture or video of a child that will be shared if the victim does not send more pictures. More often, however, this crime starts when young people believe they are communicating with someone their own age who is interested in a relationship or with someone who is offering something of value.

After the criminals have one or more videos or pictures, they threaten to publish that content, or they threaten violence, to get the victim to produce more images. The shame, fear, and confusion children feel when they are caught in this cycle often prevents them from asking for help or reporting the abuse. Caregivers and young people should understand how the crime occurs and openly discuss online safety.

Matthew 19:14 Project Supports Special Needs at ACS

Last school year, ACS received two mini-grants from the Matthew 19:14 Project at the Diocese of Phoenix. The Matthew 19:14 Project was first established in 2014 as the Arizona Catholic Schools Disabilities Fund (ACSDF). Its new title refers to the scripture quote, "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." The goal of the project has always been simple – to provide Catholic schools in Arizona with the funding, resources they need to properly accommodate and serve students with special needs.

In the fall of 2022, ACS received a \$5,000 grant to equip the Math Resource Room. We also used some of the grant to provide professional development for our teachers. In the spring of 2023 we received and additional \$5,000 that was used for hands-on math materials, the Touch Math program, a



handwriting expert, and additional materials for the Wilson Reading program. All of these materials benefit students who need extra assistance in math, reading, and fine motor skills. A new funding cycle begins August 28, and ACS will submit another grant request to support our special needs program.

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




COMMUNITY PRAYER

All School Rosary is held in the church on the second Friday of each month. Students gather with their buddies and are led in prayer by a different class each month.



SCHOOL ACCREDITATION UPDATE

Our Journey toward re-accreditation continues. We are finalizing our timeline for the WCEA accreditation visit scheduled for Fall 2024. Committees have begun working on various aspects of the Self Study process. They are gathering the information and data needed to assess our strengths and identify our areas for growth. At the end of October, vari-



ous surveys will also help us to gather the data needed to assess our overall school program.

A primary focus of this process is the assessment of our Catholic Identity as a school and how effective we are at infusing this Catholic Identity into our entire curriculum and school culture to enhance the high achievement of all students. Catholic Identity is defined as "the distinctive religious dimension found in Catholic schools which emphasizes message, community, service and worship centered in Eucharist as found in the Catholic tradition."

Another primary focus is our school mission and philosophy statements. The accreditation protocol includes a community-wide review/revision of our mission and philosophy.
