Garden Angels Club Comes to ACS



With grant funding, the ACS food forest garden broke ground in January 2023. For the past 10 months the garden has been planted in phases and has reached the stage where many helpers are needed to maintain it. Our garden club launched on November 27 with thirteen inaugural members and two magnificent leaders. The club will teach students about horticulture and plant growth and provide hands-on experience in community service. Members of our parish community are also welcome to participate in the club.

Terri and Tracy are members of St. Gabriel Parish and are trained catechists in the parish faith formation program. They both love gardening and passing on their faith to our young people. The club will meet every Monday after school for horticulture lessons and hands-on experience tending the plants in the garden. Adults who would like to volunteer in the garden can contact Keli McCann in the school office. Students interested in joining the club may register in January for the next 8-week session.

If you are wondering what's growing in the food forest garden, here is a sampling of what you will find there:

- deciduous trees such as apple, peach, fig, plum, jujube, and apricot.
- tropical plants and herbs such as mango, ice cream bean tree, bare-root bananas, dragon fruit, thyme, and rosemary.

6th grade donates to the imprisoned, inspired by literature.

St. Ignatius of Loyola taught his students to see God in all things and every person., even if that person is incarcerated. The sixth-grade class at Annunciation Catholic School finished reading the novel *Holes* by Louis Sachar and were inspired to sponsor a charity drive.

The novel takes place in a juvenile detention camp in Texas. The students collected toiletry items like soap and shampoo and donated these necessities to a juvenile detention center in Phoenix.

The book taught the students empathy for teenagers in detention and gave the students an opportunity to live out the corporal work of mercy, "Visit the Imprisoned." "We have been trying to find a theme for the sixth grade," literature teacher Edmund Hubbard said. "We started talking about the works of mercy and it has really



stuck. It is tangible. The students can really see their actions make an impact."

In the novel, the main character, Stanley, works all day in the sun. At the end of the day, he only has four minutes to take a shower. Jessica Doney is a parole officer and works overtime at a juvenile detention center in Phoenix. She said the young inmates often request items like body wash, shampoo, face wash and deodorant. "Detention provides the youth in its care with the bare minimum when it comes to toiletry items," Doney said. "For instance, the youth are given a cone of soap to wash their body and wash their hair."

The sixth-grade students understood these young adults may have made mistakes, but they still deserve basic human dignity when it comes to hygiene.

"After we read the book *Holes*," sixth grader Sami Vitolo said. "It made me think that the people in prison do need help and they need stuff and people change."

Due to regulations, only airplane carry-on size, 2-ounce containers are allowed to be donated to the detention centers. This was a perfect opportunity for the sixth graders to take their own savings and use it to purchase affordable supplies for the drive. They only needed their parents for a ride to Target.

"We felt really amazed that we somehow accomplished this," sixth grader Ariyan Baasten said. "We were giving to the poor and we also felt happy because they are going to be happy when they get the stuff."

The ACS students are not naive. They know the inmates have committed serious crimes, but the students believed they should be treated with dignity.





"Bottom line, they are still God's children," Doney said. "I am so thankful for your (school's) generosity and your humanity toward these youth that often feel misunderstood, scared, forgotten, and labeled."

Kiwanis of Carefree Awards Two More Grants to ACS!

ACS has received two more grants from the Kiwanis of Carefree. The first grant is for \$3,257 to purchase ten ScreenBeam Wireless Display Receivers. Having a wireless receiver allows for teachers to walk around and monitor the classroom while teaching on the interactive newline boards. This particular device is also very reliable and works at a faster rate than the wireless receivers we are currently using.

The second grant is for \$6,512 to purchase three more 3-D Printers for the science lab. Students in middle school enjoy using computer assisted design to create 3-D models. The addition of 3 more printers will increase the number of students who can produce 3-D models at the same time.

School Accreditation Update December 2023



Parent Survey Results

Our parent survey had a 63% response rate (WCEA considers 30% a good response rate), and the results indicate that our parents have a very high satisfaction with the school in terms of Catholic identity, academics, school staff, and administration.

- 97.8% of respondents feel that everyone in the school community knows and understands the school's mission.
- 95.5% of respondents believe that our school provides an academically rigorous Catholic religion program, taught by qualified teachers.
- 14% of respondents don't know if there is a person or group (such as a pastor or a board) who collaborates with school administration to make or recommend decisions for the success of the school.
 - ⇒ Answer: The school has an Advisory Council of 8 voting members who meet monthly with Fr. Chad and Dr. Pristash. Their current areas of focus include strengthening the partnership between parents and school, monitoring the accreditation process, and improving safety/security on campus. - Only 79% of respondents are aware that the school communicates how well students are achieving in comparison to similar students locally and/or nationally.
 - \Rightarrow Answer: We have posted our ITBS scores for grades 1-8 on the school website since 2011. We consistently score well above the national and diocesan scores at all grade levels. Follow this link to the scores on our website.
- 26.5% of respondents don't know the school's process for financial planning.
 - ⇒ Answer: The school has a Finance Council whose members include financial experts, the parish finance director and bookkeeper, pastor, principal, development director, and the chair of the Advisory Council. The Finance Council meets monthly to review finance reports and manage the budget. The school finances are published each year in the Annual Report. <u>Here's a</u> <u>link to last year's report</u>, which is found on the school website. Our latest Annual Report is in production.
- 95.6% of respondents feel that our school provides enriching programs for students to develop their gifts and talents and enhance their creative, artistic, social/emotional, physical, and spiritual potential.

Leah and Anna have been blessed to almost always finish on the podium at Nationals year after year (you have to finish in the top-5 to earn a podium spot), demonstrating they are amongst the best junior cyclists in the country.



The past 2 years have been truly amazing with Anna winning 4 National Championships in cyclocross, mountain biking (twice), and gravel and with Leah winning the silver medal in cyclocross and gravel and the bronze medal in mountain biking! Owen is still too young to compete at Nationals, but he hopes to emulate his sisters and has already won 3 State Championships in cyclocross (twice) and mountain biking.
