
Christian Service Award Winner — Lucia Garcia

Since 1998, the mission of the **Christian Service Award (CSA)**Scholarship is to acknowledge students who demonstrate exemplary Christ-centered behavior through volunteer service to their parish, school, and community. Recipients display a love and understanding of their Catholic faith and articulate a commitment, not only to perform acts of service but to live a service-focused life. They recognize their God-given gifts and provide persuasive evidence of their maturity, humility, and leadership.

Students awarded the scholarship receive an annual \$2,000 payment during each year of high school for a total of \$8,000. Lucia will be attending St. Mary's High School in the fall.

School Accreditation Update March 2024

Parent Survey Results

Our parent survey had a 63% response rate (WCEA considers 30% a good response rate), and the results indicate that our parents have a very high satisfaction with the school in terms of Catholic identity, academics, school staff, and administration.

The survey also highlighted areas where a significant number of parents have little or no knowledge. Some of those areas were clarified in the Winter 2023 newsletter. Additional items appear below.

- 97.7% of respondents feel that the school mission statement clearly expresses a commitment to Catholic identity.
- 95.6% of respondents feel that teachers help students think critically and ethically about the world around them, using the lens of Gospel values and Catholic doctrine and beliefs.
- 94% of respondents feel teachers use different teaching approaches to meet the diverse needs of all students.
- 19% of respondents don't know if all administrators, faculty, and staff engage in ongoing professional development.
 - Answer: Most of the noon dismissal school days for students are dedicated to professional development for staff in the afternoons. In addition, teachers and staff meet for professional development activities for a week after the school year ends and for the week prior to a new school year. Twice a year the teachers attend all day diocesan professional development (fall and spring Educator Day). Support staff receive professional development training related to technology, safety/security, finances, and development. ACS teachers receive professional development through *Teach for Transformation*, a program designed to support academic and affective dimensions of learning, such as intellectual and social dispositions, relationship building, and habits of mind. Teachers also participate in an annual retreat, diocesan level professional development, and individual activities chosen by teachers. ACS teachers continually seek ways to improve their teaching.
- Some parents are unaware that all teachers hold an Arizona teaching certificate, as required by the diocese.
- Some parents are also unaware that teachers are continually observed and evaluated. The principal stops by every classroom at least once a day except the few days when she is off campus. The principal conducts 3-minute walk-through observations regularly and completes a checklist that is sent to the teacher. The principal also conducts formal classroom observations annually. The school partners with Teach for Transformation who provides professional development activities for the entire faculty several times a year and provides teacher coaching/mentorship with individual teachers throughout the year.


Luis Mata, Class of 2021



Alexander Motola, Class of 2021

Alexander Motola, ACS graduate of the class of 2021, is now a junior at Brophy College Preparatory. Alexander is part of the CubeSat team at Brophy which recently launched a high-altitude weather balloon to the edge of the earth. CubeSat's objective is to launch a satellite into space, with the purpose of monitoring Valley Fever in Arizona. On Friday, March 8, Alexander and his team traveled to Tonopah, Arizona to launch a high-altitude balloon. The balloon soared to an altitude of approximately 80,000-84,000 feet, outfitted with a camera and two GPS trackers. The team utilized cutting-edge AutoCAD and 3-D printing

technology to design the payload. The mission, called DesertSky-1, was a success and they were able to retrieve the payload and were

given amazing footage and invaluable data about their prototype. Alexander and his team are now planning to use infrared cameras and AI algorithms to determine where valley fever is most likely to occur and issue a warning to nearby residents. The team has already had a few meetings with NASA and Alexander and his team are excited to pursue their next steps. Alexander's career goal is to be an aero space engineer.
