Annunciation continues to thrive in so many areas- our students are happy and getting holy. Therefore, Dr Pristash, Bill- St Gabriel's Parish Manager, and I have met with an architect who has given us preliminary drawings/plans for phase 1- a Gymnasium, and phase 2- a new building to house the 4th-8th grade when/if we expand the school to 2 classes per grade. So, now we know we have the land to add a gymnasium and school expansion, along with the possible Senior Living facility. Now we will start to assess the sustainability and feasibility of expanding Annunciation. As of writing this letter, many have asked for an update on the possible Senior Living facility, and I still have not received an update from the planners/builders on the approval from City or HOA for Construction.


Roaina Asaari

on January 10, 2024, twenty five students were inducted into the James Rapisarda Chapter of the National Junior Honor Society. The Chapter aims to develop leadership, scholarship, citizenship, service, and character traits among the students at Annunciation Catholic School. To be eligible for selection, candidates must be in the seventh or eighth-grade class and have a minimum cumulative grade average of 96% in all subject areas. Candidates are also evaluated based on their service, leadership, character, and citizenship.

The club will teach students about horticulture, plant growth, and provide handson experience in community service. Members of our parish community are also welcome to participate in the club.

A CS has received four grants from Kiwanis Club of Carefree for our 2023 - 2024 school year. The first grant for \$3,257 was used to purchase ten ScreenBeam Wireless Display Receivers. Having a wireless receiver allows for teachers to walk around and monitor the classroom while teaching on the interactive newline boards. This particular device is also very reliable and works at a faster rate than the wireless receivers we are currently using.

The second grant for \$6,512 helped us purchase three more 3-D printers for the science lab. Students in middle school enjoy using computer assisted design to create 3-D models. The addition of 3 more printers will increase the number of students who can produce 3-D models at the same time.

The third grant was for \$24,671 which will be used to replace the Chromebooks in 2nd and 3rd grade and the fourth grant helped support our Food Forest and Mary's Rose Garden. The funds purchased garden tools, mulch, plants and picnic tables for the Garden Club hands-on education, and for school families and parishoners to picnic, meditate, and pray.

The Kiwanis Club of Carefree has been very generous to Annunciation Catholic School for the past 8 years, with grants totaling over \$125,000 to support technology, special needs, and athletics. Thank you Kiwanis of Carefree!

Financial Summary

Annunciation is pleased to announce that we have successfully ended another financial year with zero debt, thanks to the generous support of our parents, parishioners, and donors. Our operational budget is funded by three sources: tuition, fundraising, and donations to the annual appeal, as well as grants and personal gifts. We were able to use designated funds from the previous fiscal year to cover expenses that occurred during the 2023-2024 academic year.

Each year, the cost of Catholic education increases. For the 2023-2024 academic year, it cost \$8,220 to educate a student. Tuition for kindergarten to 5th-grade students was \$6,300, while middle school students paid \$6,600. The difference between the cost of education and tuition fees is known as the "Gap," which is filled through fundraising and donations.
