Campus Projects on the Horizon

Senior Facility

A 125 unit facility will be built on the portion of our parish campus adjacent to Rancho Paloma Road. The facility will be built and managed by the developer. It will provide three levels of living — senior living, assisted living, and memory care. The plan is for the residents to become integral members of our Catholic Community.



Gymnasium

A full-size gymnasium with a stage is in the planning stages and will hopefully be built concurrent with the construction of the senior facility. The gymnasium will provide indoor space for athletics, PE, and many other school and parish events.

The plans for the construction project are currently at City of Phoenix awaiting permits. The developer is hoping for groundbreaking in the early part of 2026. Once we have broken ground, the construction will take 18 months or less. Watch for more information about this project in future newsletters and the church bulletin.

Student Cell Phones at ACS

Every parent will eventually hear, "Everybody has cell a phone except me!" Rest assured, it is not the case. We recently conducted a survey of all middle school parents (84 students in grades 6-8), and the results were both surprising and encouraging. Currently, **45% of our middle school students do NOT have a cell phone**. Parents who have held off on getting their child a cell phone can let go of the guilt.

For the 55% of students who *do* have a cell phone, the survey indicated that only 18 of them will bring their cell phone to school on a regular basis. Our policy for cell phone and personal devices in middle school is below. It is also in our school handbook on the website. Thank you to all parents and students who understand and respect this policy.

CELL PHONE AND PERSONAL DEVICE POLICY

The administration discourages students from bringing phones and personal devices to school, but we realize it is a necessity for some. Middle school students who bring a device to school will be required to keep it **powered off and secured** in a **locked cabinet** in the student's homeroom from arrival until dismissal. Elementary students must keep personal devices powered off and in their backpacks. Random searches of student backpacks, lunchboxes, lockers, and pockets will be conducted (see the **Right to Search** policy in the school handbook).

FIELD TRIPS

Students are not allowed to take their phones or other devices on field trips. Parent drivers are required to enforce this rule in their car. Failure to comply with this rule will result in loss of chaperone/driver privileges for that parent for the remainder of the year. This applies to the children in the car with their parents.

DISCIPLINE

If a student violates this policy, a teacher or administrator shall take the following progressively serious disciplinary measures:

- <u>1st Offense</u>: The phone/device will be confiscated, and a \$50 fine will be charged. The phone/device will need to be picked up at the school office by a parent.
- **2nd Offense**: The phone/device will be confiscated, and another \$50 fine will be charged. The phone/device will need to be picked up at the school office by a parent.
- · The student will receive a one-day suspension.
- <u>3rd Offense</u>: The phone/device will be confiscated, and a \$100 fine will be charged. The phone/device will need to be picked up at the school office by a parent.
- The student will receive a three-day suspension. For the remainder of the school year, the student will not be allowed to bring his/her phone to school.


