It's hard to believe that I have been here a full 5 years now, and the current school and Church buildings have been here a full 4 years! I continue to be so grateful for ACS, Dr. Pristash, and all the administration and faculty who are such a joy to work with. This year we added Exposition after Wednesday Mass followed by a procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the chapel for Adoration. Each week, one class participates in the procession. The students are literally following Jesus!

I want to also thank Jennie Cullen, our middle school religion teacher, who is walking with the parents, and Steven Piorkowski, St. Gabriel's new Youth Minister, who is taking on the added responsibility of forming the 25+ school children in grades 4-8 grades who want to receive Sacraments they might not have received yet and fostering the active practice of their growing faith in the family.

Looking forward, we are in the planning stage of a senior living facility on St. Gabriel property, which will be a benefit to both St. Gabriel and Annunciation - think about having grandparents living right next door from school! The building project will include the construction of a full gymnasium for the school. After the completion of the Gym (Phase 1), we will plan the school expansion project to add a second class per grade in the future (Phase 2). While I am so pleased with our current school, I am also looking forward to what Annunciation will become in the future. What an exciting time!

Senior Living Facility

A 125 unit facility will be built on the portion of our parish campus adjacent to Rancho Paloma Road. The facility will be built and managed by the developer. It will provide three levels of living — senior living, assisted living, and memory care. The plan is for the residents to become integral members of our Catholic Community.

Annunciation Catholic School Gymnasium

A full-size gymnasium with a stage will be built concurrent with the construction of the senior facility. The gymnasium will provide indoor space for athletics, PE, and many other school and parish events.

The plans for the construction project are currently at City of Phoenix awaiting permits. The developer is hoping for groundbreaking in the summer of 2026. Once we have broken ground, the construction will take 18 months or less. Watch for more information about this project in future newsletters and the church bulletin.

In November, a team of seven professional educators verified that our Self-Study reflected the wonderful teaching and learning environment that facilitates our Catholicity and high achievement for all students. The term of accreditation is for six years with annual reports due each spring to the Catholic Schools Office at the diocese. We are committed to improving student learning and to the continuous school improvement process. Zariah Garcia

AHG Stars and Stripes Project Honors The Holy Family



Congratulations to Zariah Garcia, ACS alumni from the class of 2021, on her graduation from St. Mary's Catholic High School and also on her completion of her Stars and Stripes project for the American Heritage Girls (AHG).

Zariah attended ACS from first through 8th grade. She joined AHG when she was a kindergartener. She has remained committed to the values and goals of AHG. During her senior year, her goal was to reach the penultimate achievement of AHG, earning the Stars and Stripes award. She began the process during her junior year by formulating her plan to bring a garden dedicated to the Holy Family to St. Gabriel.

She presented the idea to Fr. Chad for approval. She then designed the project, acquired the funds through outreach to the parish and community. With the help of her family, friends, and fellow AHG members, the grotto was built, and the statue was installed. It is a beautiful addition to our church grounds.

ACS Alumni Experience El Camino Ignaciano

A select group of 25 Brophy students, including Christian Bax (ACS '21) and Ryan Yparraguirre (ACS '21), recreated a powerful and physically demanding pilgrimage retracing the steps of Ignatius of Loyola. The route took the students from his home in Spain's Basque country, passing through Catalan lands, to Montserrat and Manresa. This pilgrimage is known as the Camino Ignaciano.

Along the two-week journey, the students received special behind the scenes access in churches and monasteries, including the private original church in Monserrat. They were able to witness the rib of St. Peter Claver and touch the hand of the Mary statue where Ignatius left his sword.



Jackson Stack

After graduating Annunciation Catholic School (class of 2021), Jackson Stack attended Brophy College Prep with honors. Now he continues to excel as an emerging leader in biomedical innovation. Jackson is studying Bioengineering on a Pre-Med track at Santa Clara University, he is committed to becoming a physician-engineer focused on developing accessible health technologies.

During a brief pause in his primary hemoglobin-analysis project, Jackson created KEIRA, the Knowledge-based Ensemble Intelligent Risk Assessor, a machine-learning system designed to predict cardiovascular risk. KEIRA evaluates clinical and lifestyle variables using an ensemble of Random Forest models and has already demonstrated an impressive 87.7% accuracy in early testing. Jackson is also refining his original hemoglobin device with upgraded CAD housing and new material testing.

Jackson often reflects on the formative experiences that shaped his academic and personal passions, including his time in the Annunciation music program. He recently shared with his former teacher, Mrs. Trayer, that performing at school Masses deeply influenced his lifelong love of guitar. Her encouragement, he explained, gave him confidence during pivotal years—support that helped fuel both his musical journey and the discipline he now brings to engineering, research, and service.


Today, in addition to his studies and research on early-stage disease detection, Jackson volunteers in hospital settings and works part-time as an EMT—living out the values of service, curiosity, and compassion fostered during his years at Annunciation Catholic School.

Michael Khoury, a 5th grade student at Annunciation Catholic School, believes that easier access to a wide variety of books can make a difference in the lives of struggling students. In February and March of 2025, Michael organized a book drive hosted by the St. George Antiochian Orthodox Church in Phoenix to collect new and gently used reading materials so that kids in his community could share in the thrill of learning a new word, or help solve a mystery set in ancient Egypt, or to own a personal set of a series of books, even when they don't have a place called home. Michael enlisted the help of his peers in the Vibrant Vinnies to help him sort and organize the almost 1,000 books which were donated, far exceeding his initial goal of 350.

The donated books were distributed through the St. Vincent de Paul Society to multiple children, veterans, and homeless resource agencies throughout the Phoenix area - creating a lasting impact and inspiring his peers to echo, "what is something I can do?" when planning future service projects.


We can't wait to cheer on this incredible group of girls as they make history on the field and pave the way for future generations of ACS athletes.

Endowments



One of the distinguishing characteristics of an endowment fund is that the principal amount contained in the account is not disbursed for any reason. This principal amount is invested in a manner that creates a steady return.

Financial Summary

Annunciation Catholic School is pleased to share that we closed the fiscal year with zero debt, a reflection of responsible stewardship and the extraordinary generosity of our parents, parishioners, and benefactors. Our operational budget is sustained through a combination of tuition, fundraising initiatives, annual appeal contributions, grants, and personal gifts. In addition, designated funds from the previous fiscal year allowed us to meet expenses incurred during the 2023–2024 academic year.

The cost of providing a high-quality Catholic education continues to rise each year. For the 2024–2025 academic year, the actual cost to educate one student was \$9,582. Tuition for kindergarten through fifth grade was set at \$7,000 while middle school tuition was \$7,300. The difference between the true cost of education and tuition—commonly referred to as the “Gap”—is bridged through fundraising efforts and the generous support of our community.
